Hi does anyone have official confirmation that the lake will be sailable Monday, albeit the north end car park will be closed.

Confirmation from either the lake wardens, Wirral BC, or the Contractor's themselves.
As soon as the contractors are on site, their insurance will kick in, any accidents on site will be their responsibility. The Site defined as the lake the wall and the car parks.

Although they cannot stop sailing on the estuary, they can however enforce their right to stop any activities on site including sailing on the lake, in order to minimise risks.
